Programme Advisory Committee (PAC) Meeting of B.E. Mechanical Engineering Programme for the academic year of 2022 – 2023, was held on 20.7.2023 at 10.30 a.m. in the Seminar Hall.

The following Programme Advisory Committee (PAC) Members were present in the meeting and shared their valuable suggestions and feedback.

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Based on the CO – PO attainment consolidation:

1. If CO is attained increase the target level for the next academic year. If it is not attained, then the target level may be revised or an area of additional focus can be identified.
2. Basic principles related to the problematic courses may be taught at the beginning of the particular topic.
3. Course content has to be organized and delivered in sequence.
4. If credit given to the course is not sufficient to complete the syllabus, then credits can be increased to 4 or obsolete topics can be removed if the same credit has to be maintained.

Based on students' feedback:

1. Offering extra classes for students (remedial classes).

2. Interactive Teaching - Encourage teachers to use more engaging methods like quizzes, hands-on activities, and tutoring activities for concepts with problem-solving.
3. Industrial Visits may be arranged.
4. For lateral entry students, classes for mathematics may be revised.

Feedback arrives based on Faculty, Alumni, Employer and Parents:

- Enhance the overall infrastructure and facilities to meet parents' expectations.
- Provide more opportunities for extra-curricular activities to support holistic student development.
- Evaluate and strengthen the degree program's alignment with job market requirements to assist students in job acquisition.
