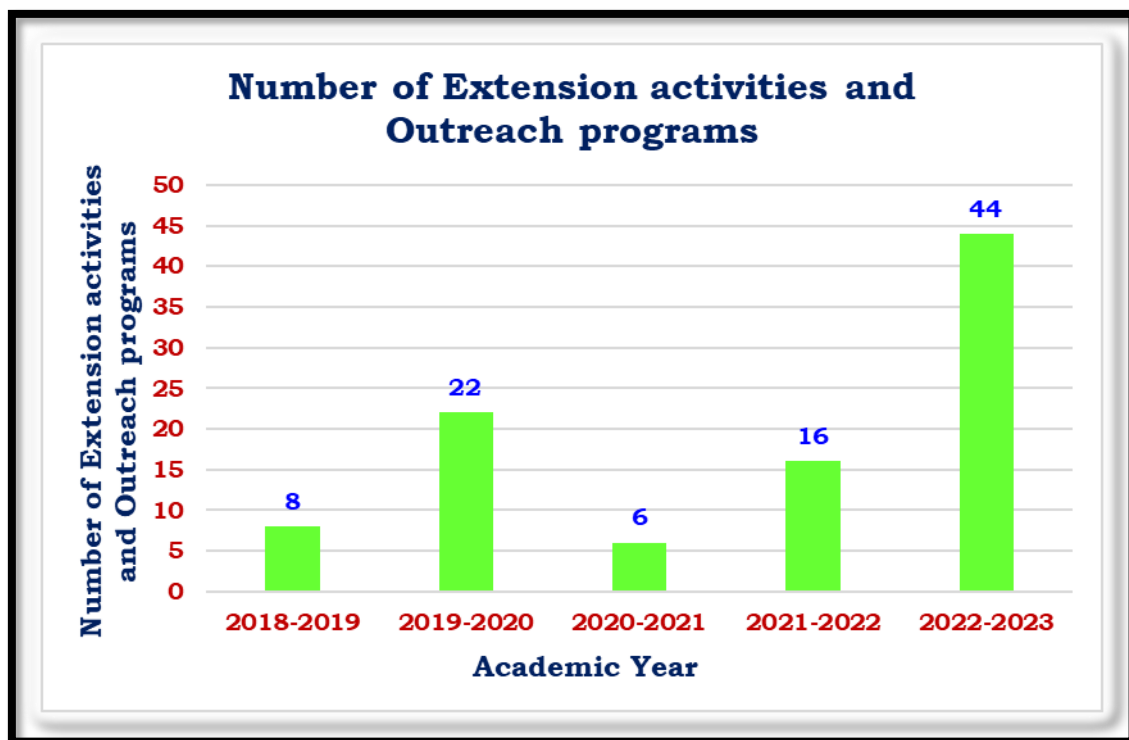

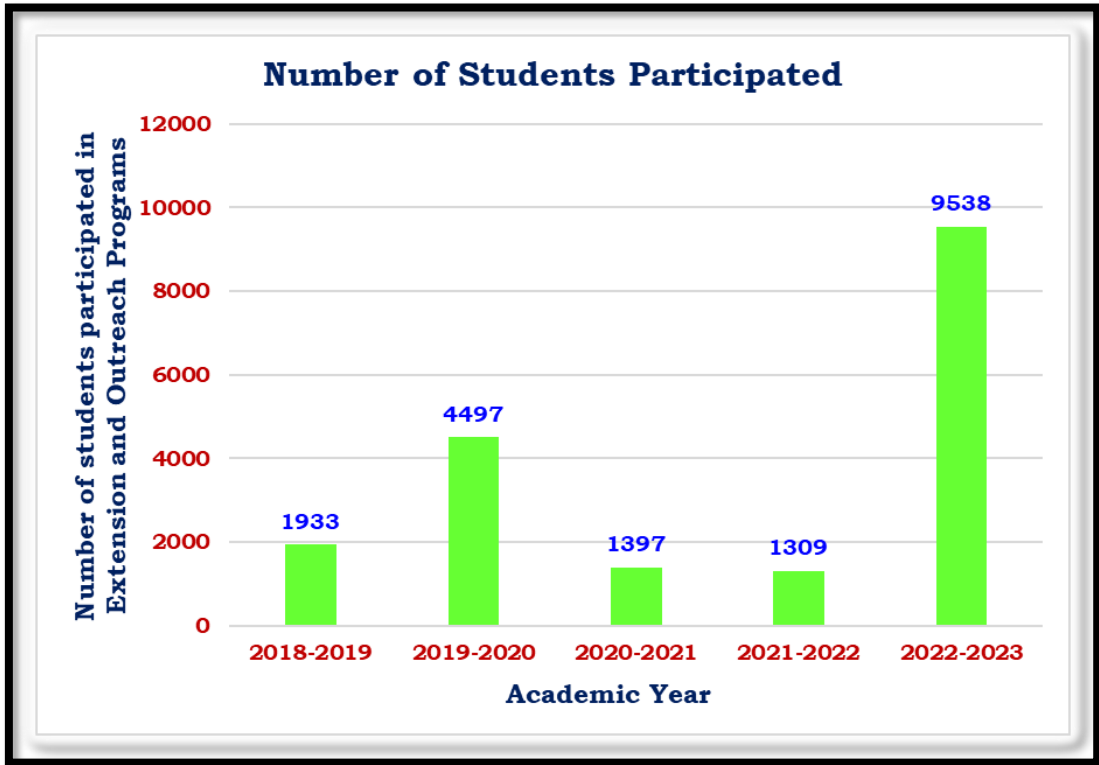

2. Gaja cyclone relief Campaign

As the main motto of our club is to serve people, we the Leos of Government college of Engineering , Salem help those people in need during the GAJA cyclone relief around Karuppur.

Our Principal mam Dr. G. Vimala Rosaline decided to help people of affected places and called our Leo club students to collect funds and things from staff and our students. Our club students started collecting money as well as things from November 22, 2018. Most of the students participated willingly in donating things. Lots of goods and amounts were received from them. Both the technical and non-technical staff also donated relief materials.

A total amount of about Rs.13,000 were collected and lots of goods like food items, bedsheets, mats, towel , muffler, daily things and groceries like rice , milk powder , etc...were brought using that amount . Things like dresses and candles were received from the students directly.

One of our college students is from the remote area of Mannarkudi in Thiruvavur district, those places are one of the most affected places during Gaja cyclone and didn't receive any kind of helps at those time. We decided to distribute the collected things in that place. Our Leo club students directly carry all those things to Mannarkudi and distribute those at that place.
