Programme Advisory Committee (PAC) Meeting of B.E. Mechanical Engineering Programme for the academic year of 2020 – 2021, was held on 21.7.2021 at 10.30 a.m. in the Seminar Hall.

The following Programme Advisory Committee (PAC) Members were present in the meeting and shared their valuable suggestions and feedback.

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Based on the CO – PO attainment consolidation:

1. Basic principles related to the problematic courses may be taught at the beginning of the particular topic.
2. Course content has to be organized and delivered in sequence.
3. Students are encouraged to solve more complex problems in concepts related to CO which are not attained.
4. Pre-requisite subjects may be revised, before studying the particular course for which CO is not attained.

Based on students' feedback:

1. For Theory paper faculties are encouraged to use tools like PPTs including demonstrating videos for working principles.
2. Subject content needs to be revised in sequence.

3. Faculties are encouraged to attend FDPs on their specialization.
4. More focus should be given to slow learners.
5. Try identifying learning difficulties at the earliest through mentor-mentee sessions and class committee meetings.

Feedback arrives based on Faculty, Alumni, Employer and Parents:

- Review and update the curriculum to better align with industry standards and higher education requirements.
- Increase the range and frequency of co-curricular activities to enhance the overall development of students.
