1. INTRODUCTION

In 1966, under the Third Five-Year Plan, the Government of Tamil Nadu established the Government College of Engineering, Salem-11, marking it as the third government engineering college inaugurated in the region. Nestled within a 162-hectare expanse, embraced by verdant surroundings, the college embarked on its academic journey by welcoming its inaugural batch of students for the 1966-1967 academic year. Ever since, it has been on a continuous trajectory of evolution to cater to the dynamic demands of technical education.

The college is driven by a visionary goal to sculpt not only exemplary engineers in the realms of Science and Technology but also to nurture them into responsible citizens. It is dedicated to forging well-rounded individuals, equipped with comprehensive knowledge, who are poised to contribute to the nation's progress and development. Emphasizing the delivery of contemporary technical education, the college aspires to empower the next generation of engineers with cutting-edge knowledge.

As an autonomous entity, sanctioned by both the AICTE and the UGC, and affiliated with Anna University, Chennai, the college offers a diverse portfolio of academic programs, including six undergraduate, six postgraduate, and four part-time undergraduate courses. It is recognized for its research capabilities, hosting Ph.D. and M.S. programs under Anna University's aegis across various engineering disciplines. Notably, it serves as a QIP (Quality Improvement Programme) center endorsed by the AICTE, focusing on research leading to Ph.D. degrees in the fields of Mechanical, Civil, and Electrical and Electronics Engineering.

The Civil Engineering Department stands out for its remarkable revenue from Testing and Consultancy services. The Electrical and Electronics Engineering Department has made significant contributions to electrical energy conservation and auditing. The Metallurgical Engineering Department boasts

a vital industrial connection with JSW, enhancing student placement opportunities, while the Electronics and Communication Engineering Department ensures seamless internet connectivity throughout the campus. Lastly, the Computer Science and Engineering Department, the newest addition to the college, not only keeps the institute's website current but also boasts a 100% placement rate annually.

2. INFRASTRUCTURE

All the departments have well-qualified faculty members and excellent infrastructure facilities.

Investment in Infrastructure and Equipment:

- **❖ Total Expenditure on Infrastructure:** Rs.679.49 lakhs encompassing all departments.
- **❖ Total Expenditure on Academic Support:** Rs.167.85 lakhs was utilized for maintenance of physical activities and academic supports.
- **❖ Total Expenditure on purchase of books/e-books:** Rs.1123 lakhs was spent encompassing all departments.
- ❖ Indoor Stadium: The Government have accorded Administrative sanction Rs.800 lakhs in Government College of Engineering, Salem-11 for constructing indoor stadium.
- ❖ The indoor stadium includes 4 court rooms for ball badminton (6.10m x 13.40m), 1 basketball court (28.65m x 15.24m), Dormitory hall for Gents & Ladies, Coach room, Dress changing room for boys & girls, Store room, Gym area, Separate zones for games like Table tennis, Carrom, Chess and other indoor games.

There is provision for gallery in the first floor with seating capacity of 250, raised stage in ground floor, 4 Stair case which includes emergency stair and a portico facility.

❖ Augmented and Virtual Reality Laboratory:

Establishment: Launched in May 2022 within the Research and Development Block.

Investment in Lab Equipment: Hardware components valued at Rs. 23.6 lakhs and software materials worth Rs. 23.69052 lakhs.

❖ Innovate TN Lab: The Tamil Nadu Startup and Innovation Mission (TANSIM) has approved the establishment of Fab-Marker space Labs (Innovate TN Lab) at GCE, Salem, in February 2022. Rs.100 lakhs was allotted for establishment of Innovate TN Lab at college premises. An amount of Rs.53.37 lakhs was allotted this year and has been utilized for setting.

Computing and Internet Facilities:

Computer Facilities: The college is equipped with state-of-the-art computer facilities with student -computer ratio of 3.74:1

Internet Connectivity: It boasts an Internet Bandwidth of 1Gbps, including access to the National Knowledge Network (NKN) and a BSNL Internet Leased Line (ILL).

***** Hostel and Accommodation:

The college dormitory has different sections for students in their First, Second, Third, and Final year of B.E (Bachelor of Engineering), as well as special areas for M.E (Master of Engineering) students. Both boys and girls have Wi-Fi. A new girls' hostel with 38 rooms, accommodating 3 students per room, was recently inaugurated with estimate of Rs.865.98 lakhs in area of 27901.54 Sq.Ft.

Centre for Foreign Languages

The Director of Technical Education (DOTE) has invited the proposal to establish a "**Centre for Foreign Languages**", the design of the lab and procurement are yet to be completed. The total estimation for the installation of the centre is nearly 1050 lakhs.

- ❖ Protosem is an 18-week graduate innovation Engineering programme offered as a comprehensive skills and competency development programme that embeds an innovation-centered approach integrated into the Engineering curriculum. Student's efforts towards designing, developing, and deploying innovative solutions to the real-world problems the industry provides. 4.1 Innovation mentor - capacity building program

This is a joint initiative of Anna University, ICT Academy of Tamilnadu, NASSCOM and IBM supported by the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation under the Naan Mudhalvan scheme of Govt. of Tamilnadu.

As a part of this program, Anna University is offering an EEC category MANDATORY course "PROFESSIONAL READINESS FOR INNOVATION, EMPLOYABILITY AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP" with 3 credits (as an extended 4-5 months Hackathon) to all 6th semester students of B.E. CSE and B.E. ECE. They will earn the credits in the 7th semester on completion of this course.

Total Number of Students benefited for 2022-2023 is 129.

5.2 Internship

Internship has been mandated for students for obtaining degree for all students.

During this academic year, a total of 502 students underwent internships at various reputed firms, and many students completed their final year projects in industries also.
