**PROHIBITION OF RAGGING IN TAMILNADU
EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS
EXTRACT OF ACT No.7 OF 1997**

SHORT-TITLE, EXTENT AND COMMENCEMENT

1. This act is called The TamilNadu Prohibition of Ragging Act.1997
2. It is applicable to the whole of Tamil Nadu.
3. This act comes into force on the 19th Day of December 1996

DEFINITION

- a) In this act unless the context otherwise requires, 'ragging' means DISPLAY OF NOISY, DISORDERLY CONDUCT, DOING ANY ACT WHICH CAUSES OR IS LIKELY TO CAUSE PHYSICAL OR PSYCHOLOGICAL HARM OR RAISE APPREHENSION OR FEAR OR SHAME OR EMBARRASSMENT TO A STUDENT in any educational institution and includes _
- b) TEASING, ABUSING OR PLAYING PRACTICAL JOKES OR CAUSING HURT TO STUDENTS or asking the student to do any act or perform something which a student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

Ragging within or outside any educational institution is prohibited.

PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates "ragging" within or outside any educational institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 2 years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

DISMISSAL OF STUDENT

Any student convicted of an offence under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the educational institution and such a student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

SUSPENSION OF STUDENT

- i) Without prejudice to the foregoing provision, whenever any student complains of ragging to the Head of an educational institution or to any other person responsible for management of the educational institution, such head of the educational institution shall enquire into the matter immediately and if found true, shall suspend the student who has committed the offence from the educational institution.
- ii) The decision of the Head of the Educational Institution in this regard under sub-section (i) shall be final.

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A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE INSTITUTION

Government College of Engineering, Salem - 11, the Temple of Excellence in Technical Education was started in 1966 during the 3rd Five Year Plan and is located at a beautiful 162 hectares site surrounded by hills. This was then the 3rd Government Engineering Institution in Tamil Nadu. The first batch of students was admitted for the academic year 1966 - 67 for courses in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical and Electronics Engineering. In the Academic year 1973 - 74, Metallurgical Engineering branch was started. Electronics and Communication branch was introduced during the year 1985 - 86. Computer Science and Engineering branch was introduced in the year 2001.

The following Under Graduate courses and Post Graduate courses are accredited by NBA : B.E. Civil Engineering, B.E. Mechanical Engineering, B.E. Electronics and Communication Engineering, B.E. Electrical and Electronics Engineering, M.E. Power Electronics and Drives. Part-time B.E. courses are offered in Civil, Mechanical, Electrical and Electronics, Electronics and Communication Engineering. Autonomous Status was conferred on the institution in 2008 by Anna University and the University Grants Commission and since then the status has been maintained.

All the Departments have been granted recognition for guiding research work leading to **Ph.D.** under the Anna University, Chennai. The Institution is the Zonal Centre for conducting Anna University examinations in the colleges located in Salem Zone.

Our Institution is one of the eleven Technical Institutions in Tamilnadu selected for World Bank financial assistance under Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme (**TEQIP**). The Institution received a sum of Rs. 10.967 crores (phase-I) and Rs. 12.5 crores (phase-II) as life time allocation for the project implementation spread over a period of four years from 2003 to 2007 and 2012 to 2014. An additional assistance of Rs.5 crores was bagged by the institution for the academic year 2015-2016 based upon the performance appraisal. The **TEQIP** Phase - II was extended upto 2016 and then further extension was granted till March 2017. The institution also received a sum of Rs.7 Crores under **TEQIP-III** during 2017-2021.

Our Institution is the **QIP** centre, recognised by AICTE for doing PG and also research leading to Ph.D. in Mechanical, Civil, Electrical and Electronics Engineering branches.

The existing buildings include Civil Engineering Block, Computer Science and Engineering Block, Electronics & Communication Engineering Block, Electrical & Electronics Engineering Block, Mechanical Engineering Block, Metallurgical Engineering Block, First Year Block, Physical Education Block, Administrative Block, Library Block, Digital Library Block, Auditorium, Canteen, Health Centre, Planetarium, Seven Hostel Blocks, Five Mess

Halls, Recreation Halls, Research and Development Block, Alumni Centre, Teaching Learning Centre, Quality Assurance Centre, Centre for Augmented reality and Virtual Reality and blocks for residential accommodation for the staff members of the college.

Our college celebrated Golden Jubilee Year in 2016.

During the past 50 years, all the departments have not only established themselves but also equipped their laboratories sufficiently to cater to the needs of the various Under-graduate, Post-graduate and available Research programmes. Computer facilities are available in all the Engineering Departments.

The Institute has been selected as one of the 33 regional centres in India to collaborate with IIT, Mumbai and ISTE to offer courses and training via. video conferencing. NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning) Local Chapter was established in our Institution during the academic year 2018-2019 to support Students and Faculties for open online courses with certification.

There is a visible progress every year in the number of students of all branches getting placed in leading companies through placement cell. Our Institution has signed MOU with Infosys, Bangalore-Springboard, ICT Academy, Vi Microsystems Pvt. Ltd., Chennai, Pantech Prolobs India Pvt. Ltd., Chennai, Frontline Science Foundation, Salem, Frontline Electronics Pvt. Ltd., Salem, Sinetec Technologies, Coimbatore, SunShiv Electronics, Coimbatore, NHAI (Salem to Krishnagiri Stretch), CATT Centre of Training and Irrigation management training Institute-Trichy.

Our college is recognized as Member Partner Institute in Infosys/campus connect. Our college is also a member of ICT academic.

The practice titled "On our way to Molding Smart Engineers" submitted by our college was selected in the category of skill development and got published in Best practices-Student Engagement in Tamil Nadu - a compendium, by ICT Academy during the 32nd Edition of Bridge 2018 - March 2018.

Naan Mudhalvan platform aims to provide dynamic information for college students on courses and relevant information about industry specific skill offerings. This will enable the students of TamilNadu to get training in their chosen field of interest that will help them in achieving their career goals. The objective of this scheme is to identify potential training providers, to impart various skill trainings based on current industry gaps.

The college is thus growing from strength to strength and gaining recognition for its contribution to the cause of Engineering Education.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

1. Exchange of greetings with the members of the staff in the college and hostel by saying "Vanakkam" or "Good Morning / afternoon / evening" is encouraged.
2. A minimum of 75% of attendance in subjects, tour and camps will be insisted upon for each semester individually.
3. Students must be punctual for each period.
4. Attendance for the college examination is compulsory and leave or absence from the examination will be permitted only on valid reasons.
5. Students should maintain good progress and conduct which are prerequisites for appearing for the University Examination.
6. Students should avail leave only with the prior permission from the Faculty Advisor. When leave is availed for unforeseen causes, a leave application must be submitted soon after the availing of the leave. Such application will be considered only on the production of a Medical Certificate from the College Doctor, or the applicant should produce evidence of the unforeseen cause. No student should write an application for leave on behalf of another student. Students who avail leave should furnish their address to the Principal and the Deputy Warden.
7. In case of serious illness and infectious diseases, students should report to the concerned Deputy Warden and the College Medical Officer for necessary action.
8. All male students are expected to wear pants and shirts neatly tucked in or bush shirts. The dress must be clean. Female students are expected to wear chudidhar with dupattas. Half sarees, skirts and frocks are not permitted. In the workshop, male students shall wear only shirts and trousers. Chappals worn in the workshop or in field work must be securely strapped at the heel. Female students will have to wear pants, shirts and shoes for the practical classes in the workshop, and for other laboratory classes they will have to wear overcoats. While playing games, shorts and vests or jerseys must be worn by male students.
9. Students will have to pay for breakage or losses in the laboratories and workshop.
10. Students should equip themselves with approved instrument boxes, text books, record note books and sheets, field books and note books which can be purchased from the Students' Co-operative stores or any other bookshop.
11. Usage of cellphones during the class hours is strictly prohibited. If found cellphones will be confiscated.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The College has a library located in a separate block containing books pertaining to the various courses of study in this institution as well as a limited number of books of general value and interest.

The number of volumes at present is 66,139 and more books are being added. Besides books, more than 120 journals and other periodicals are subscribed to. The current issues of the journals are displayed on the racks and the back volumes are bound together. Under TEQIP, 1445 books have been procured. A book bank with 1316 books is available for SC/ST students.

The Universal Decimal classification system is adopted in the library.

Five books to each student and eight books for the students who are getting the "Government of India Post - Matric Scholarship" are issued at the beginning of the semester. The books issued to the students are returned to library on the same day or next day of the end of the theory examination of the semester.

No book is retained for the arrear exams.

A fine of Rs. 1/- (Rupee one) per day per book is collected for the delayed return of books.

Students leave their books, note books and bags at the places provided while entering the library.

Silence is observed within the library.

READING HOURS

- The library is kept open on all week days from 10.00 a.m. to 5.45 p.m.
- The library is closed on Saturdays and Sundays and other Government holidays.
- During the period of vacation the library will remain closed for students only.

HOURS FOR RETURN OF BOOKS

- The books are returned during working hours of the library on all days.
- Absence from the college is not admitted as an excuse for the delay in the return of books.
- If the due date falls on a holiday for the library, the next working day is taken as the due date.

Rules and Regulations of the library are displayed on the notice board of the library.

DEPARTMENT LIBRARY

Every department has its own library, well stocked with reference books and text books, readily accessible to students and staff of their respective departments.

DIGITAL LIBRARY

The College has a Digital Library to access e-journals, e-books and NPTEL video lectures with a capacity of one hundred. A Video conferencing hall is also been established with a seating capacity of 161. This facility is the first of its kind among all Government Institutions with in Tamil Nadu. E-resources can be accessed at "ANY WHERE ANY TIME" through username password basis. Our College Library is a Institutional Member in DELNET.

CO-OPERATIVE STORE

A Consumer Co-operative store functions in the premises of the institution. It is open to the students and the staff of this college.

It supplies books, instruments, stationery, and other necessary utensils, to students and staff.

The celestial sky is projected on a dome and its daily apparent motion is simulated by using special equipment. A 'star carrier' with thirty one high quality optical projectors all over its surface projects the different sections of the sky with stars in a breath taking display of the glorious night sky. The small dome facilitates effective teaching. It can accommodate 55 members at a sitting. Schools, colleges, clubs and the general public regularly avail of this rare viewing facility at the planetarium.

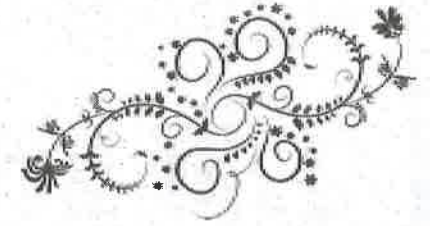
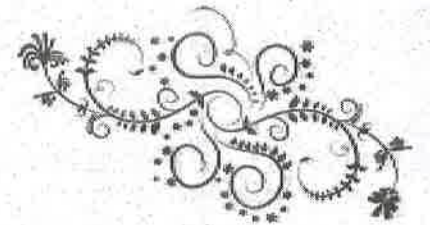

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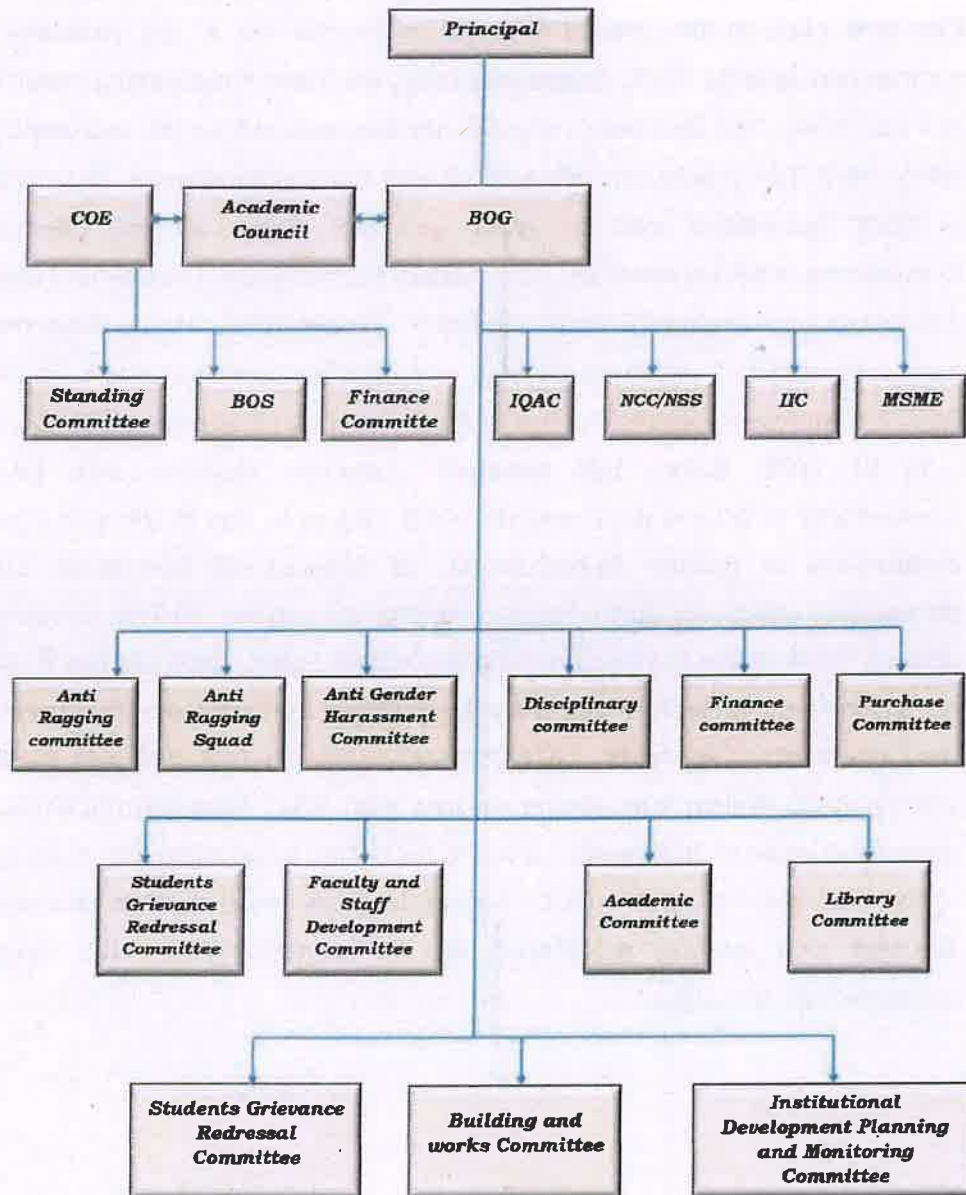
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About the Institute

Code of Ethics

1. Preamble

The code of conduct is established to safeguard the fundamental values of the Government College of Engineering and to foster the intellectual and civic growth of students, creating a secure and conducive learning environment.

2. Applicability

The Code of Conduct applies to all students enrolled in full-time and part-time undergraduate programs, scholars in full-time and part-time postgraduate programs, and scholars in full-time and part-time Ph.D. programs.

3. Jurisdiction

The jurisdiction of the Code extends to the on-campus behaviour of all students across the college's various locations. This includes:

- Meeting academic course requirements and engaging in credit-bearing experiences, such as internships, field trips, and study abroad/student exchange programs.
- Participating in activities that contribute to the pursuit of a degree, such as research at another institution or professional practice assignments.
- Involvement in activities authorized, conducted, or sponsored by the Institution or registered student organizations.
- Engaging in actions resulting in significant damage to college property or causing harm to the health and safety of the college community members.
- Participation in any activity where a police report has been filed, a summons or indictment issued, or an arrest has occurred for any act or omission.

While on campus, students remain subject to local laws, and violations of these laws may also be considered violations of the Code. In such cases, the college has the authority to initiate disciplinary action independently under the Code, regardless of concurrent criminal proceedings. Sanctions for Code violations may be imposed even if the criminal process is ongoing or unresolved.

4. Responsibilities of Students

All students in this institution are obligated to adhere to conduct standards that contribute to academic goals and the well-being of the academic community. They are expected to uphold high standards of academic and professional honesty, and integrity, and to respect the rights, privileges, and property of fellow members and society at large.

Students must refrain from any conduct that disrupts institutional functions or poses a threat to the health, welfare, or safety of others. Discrimination based on various factors is strictly prohibited, and students must conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the laws of the land.

5. Student Participation in Governance

As important stakeholders, students are encouraged to actively engage in the governance of the institution, both in administrative and academic capacities. Their participation is vital for informed decision-making, fostering a collaborative and inclusive environment.

6. Disciplinary Misconduct

Students found committing or attempting the following misconduct will face appropriate disciplinary action. These instances are illustrative, and the institution reserves the right to take disciplinary action in appropriate circumstances not set out in this article.

6.1. Academic Misconduct:

This includes copying, cheating, plagiarism, and any form of dishonesty in assignments or examinations.

6.2. Disruptive Conduct:

Intentional actions that substantially obstruct or disrupt teaching, freedom of movement, or other lawful activities on campus.

6.3. Discrimination:

Engaging in verbal or physical behaviour that creates an intimidating or demeaning environment based on origin, race, creed, gender, religious beliefs, or sexual orientation that, according to a person of reasonable sensibilities various factors.

6.4. Falsification:

Providing false, misleading, or incomplete information to institution officials or forging official records.

6.5. Illegal or Unauthorized Possession or Use:

Possession or use of weapons, drugs, alcohol, smoking, or any unauthorized access to institutional property.

6.6. Act of Violence, Threatening, Harassing, or Assaultive Conduct:

Engaging in behaviour that may cause harm or threaten the safety or welfare of others.

6.7. Theft, Property Damage, and Vandalism:

Involvement in theft, property damage, or vandalism of any kind.

6.8. Recording of Images without Knowledge:

Unauthorized recording of any person in a private location without consent.

6.9. Causing Disrepute to Other Students:

Engaging in acts that bring disrepute to other students or faculty.

6.10. Ragging:

Any act that constitutes ragging, as defined by UGC and AICTE Prohibition of Ragging Regulations, 2009.

6.11. Contracts:

Students are prohibited from entering into agreements or contracts that bind the institution without proper authorization.

6.12. Abuse of Electronic Communication:

Misuse of institutional or personal communication networks for illegal or improper purposes.

6.13. Media Contact:

Speaking on behalf of the institution to media organizations without express written permission.

6.14. Organization and Event Registration:

Forming organizations, societies, or organizing events without written permission from the institution.

6.15. Presenting False Testimony:

Knowingly making false statements regarding disciplinary matters.

6.16. Violation of Institution Rules:

Violating published institution regulations, policies, or rules.

7. Grievance Redressal:

Students can submit grievances to the Institution Grievance Cell (IGC) and resolution processes are clearly outlined.

8. Punishment and Penalties

Various actions may be taken in response to violations, including warning, suspension, monetary fines, confiscation, restriction of privileges, dismissal, or other appropriate sanctions.

9. General Etiquette

- Students are expected to wear clean, neat, and culturally appropriate attire.

- Classroom movement requires permission from the respective teacher during class hours.
- Respectful and healthy relationships between students of both sexes are encouraged.
- Proper use of library and internet facilities during leisure hours is advised.
- Latecomers must provide valid reasons for classroom entry.
- Furniture and property must be handled with care to avoid penalties or suspension.
- Engagement in anti-social activities is strictly prohibited.

Government College of Engineering, Salem maintains a strict policy of Zero Tolerance towards any form of ragging. Students engaging in such activities will be subject to immediate and strict disciplinary action. The college unequivocally prohibits ragging, both within its premises and outside. It is a collective aim of the Government College of Engineering, Salem's community, including administration, faculty, staff, students, and their parents/guardians, to establish a ragging-free environment. This ensures a supportive setting for new students to adjust to college life and develop alongside their seniors. The institution pledges adherence to all rules and guidelines issued by the UGC and other authoritative bodies. Any incidents of ragging are not tolerated, and the college is dedicated to implementing all necessary measures to eradicate ragging entirely from the campus.

Behaviours banned by this policy:

Government College of Engineering, Salem adheres to the UGC Regulations for preventing the problem of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 (F.1-6/2007(CPP-II) dated 17th June,2009), and enforces strict measures against anyone found guilty of engaging in ragging, assisting in ragging whether actively or passively, or being involved in a scheme to encourage ragging, following these and any other prevailing Regulations. **According to the UGC, Ragging includes any one or more of the acts listed in the UGC regulations on curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, dated 17.06.2009, Paragraph 3.** The acts mentioned are:

1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
2. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or

psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.

3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts, or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority, or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Complaint procedure:

The information on ragging can be received in the following manner by the student

1. Students can register the complaint with the Principal.
2. Students can access the following 24 hours toll free telephone number or website of UGC to register their complaints regarding ragging for which action will be taken within 24 hours keeping the intimation confidential.
Helpline No. 1800 - 180-5522

3. Through the notified contact details of the committee members or anti ragging squads.
4. Through any other member of the institute
5. From any external source.

Punishments for ragging:

Each case of ragging at Government College of Engineering, Salem will undergo a thorough investigation by a member of the college's Anti-Ragging Committee. This member will gather all pertinent details and report their findings and suggestions to the Principal of Government College of Engineering, Salem. Upon receiving these recommendations, or any information about a ragging incident, the Principal will assess whether the incident warrants filing a case under criminal laws. If deemed necessary, the Principal, or a designated Anti-Ragging Committee member, will file a First Information Report (FIR) with the police and relevant local authorities within 24 hours, based on the applicable penal provisions and the specific clauses outlined in the UGC Regulations. Moreover, the Anti-Ragging Committee of Government College of Engineering, Salem will impose appropriate punishments on those found guilty, depending on the severity and nature of the offense as determined by the investigation, which could include one or more of the disciplinary actions outlined in the regulations.

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
2. Withholding withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation
4. process.
5. Withholding results.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension, expulsion from the hostel.
8. Cancellation of admission.

9. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
10. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

If the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the college will resort to collective punishment. Government College of Engineering Salem will seek to prevent & correct any such behaviours from its students. (As per UGC Regulations, an appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institution lies with the Vice-Chancellor of Anna University, Chennai)


Action to be taken by the head of the Institution:

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution of Government College of Engineering Salem shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorised by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely

1. Abetment to ragging,
2. Criminal conspiracy to rag.
3. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging.
4. Public nuisance created during ragging.
5. Violation of decency and morals through ragging
6. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt,
7. Wrongful restraint,
8. Wrongful confinement,
9. Use of criminal force,
10. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences,


11. Extortion,
12. Criminal trespass,
13. Offences against property,
14. Criminal intimidation,
15. Attempts to commit any or all the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s),
16. Threat to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s)
17. Physical or psychological humiliation,
18. All other offences following from the definition of ragging.

Provided that the Head of the institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging officer. Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.


Digital Mark Sheets and Timetables: Generation and distribution of mark sheets, as well as the publishing of examination timetables, are done electronically through the institution's website.

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Grievances Redressal Policy

Overview

To address the grievances of the students, parents and others, as per All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) regulations, 2012 under clause 1 of section 23 of the AICTE Act, 1987 regarding the establishment of Mechanism for Grievance Redressal in Technical Institutions, Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) is formed in the college. The objective of GRC is to develop a harmonious educational environment in the institute.

Composition and Tenure of the Committee

- The committee shall comprise of a Chairperson, Convener and two other senior teaching faculty members.
- Principal of the college shall be the Chairperson. Members of the committee shall be nominated by the chairperson for tenure of
- two years. Out of Four (including convener), one member shall be female and other from SC/ST/OBC category.
- A representative from among the students of the college to be nominated by the chairperson as special invitee.

Scope of the grievances

Grievances may be related to any of the following matters:

- Academic Matters Issues related to assessment, attendance, marks, and other examination related matters.
- Financial Matter - Issues related to charging of fees, scholarships and payments.
- Administration Matters Issues related to infrastructure, basic amenities, sanitation, transport, or victimization.
- Harassment and ragging by colleague students or teachers etc.

Grievance receiving mechanisms:

Anyone with a genuine grievance may lodge their complaint to GRC along with necessary documents, if any. The grievance shall be reported by using any of the following modes:

- Report submission in person by approaching the chairman of the Committee.
- Online submission of Grievance form, through Institute website <https://gcesalem.edu.in>
- Writing to The Chairman/Principal, Grievance Redressal Committee, Government College of Engineering, Salem-636011".
- Dropping the grievances in the Suggestion Box placed in the institute premises.
- Voice out the Grievances in the Quality Circle Committee meeting at the departmental Level
- Reporting the grievance in Students Counsellors meeting.
- Reporting Hostel Grievances (by Hostellers) through complaint Note or directly to Hostel Resident Tutor.

Grievance redressal mechanism

- After the receipt of the application from the aggrieved, the chairman of GRC shall fix the date, time and venue of the meeting after having a discussion with the
- The meeting shall be scheduled within Ten days of receipt of the application.
- All relevant papers shall be circulated as hard / soft so copy to all the members on or before the date of the meeting.
- After fixing of the date of the meeting, a hard copy of the notice must be sent to the applicant to be present in the meeting and convey his or her grievances before the Committee and the acknowledgement of receipt would be placed on record.
- The Committee members are expected to deliberate upon the case, the grievance of the applicant and the rules laid down by the institute.

- The brief facts, evidence and final recommendations by the Committee members shall be recorded in the format of minutes of the meeting.
- The minutes shall be circulated to all the members of the Grievance Committee for their signatures.
- The decision of the Grievance Committee shall be communicated in writing to the applicant at the earliest.


Appeal

- The applicant shall have the right to file an appeal to the Chairman within 15 days from the date of the written communication of recommendations of the committee.
- The applicant shall send written communication to the college conveying his desire to file an appeal to the Chairman. The college shall place the appeal along with all relevant material before the Ombudsperson and inform the applicant accordingly. The Chairman shall within a reasonable time decide the Final decision would be communicated to the applicant by the college.


Process of Implementation and adherence to the Policy:


Goal:
